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Introduction:

- "Unless I am convinced by Scared Scripture or by evident reason, I will not recant. (Because) my conscience is held captive by the Word of God and to act against conscience is neither right nor safe."
- those immortal words were uttered by Martin Luther at the Diet of Worms
- you see, Luther was on trial for his life before the authorities of both the church and the state, charged with serious heresy
- when commanded to recant his doctrine of justification by faith, he insisted that his doctrine was based on the Bible
- therefore, he could recant nothing, because "to act against conscience is neither right nor safe"
- the Protestant Reformation was the dispute over the doctrine of justification by faith alone in Christ alone
- in essence, a dispute over Biblical authority
- Sola Scriptura, Scripture Alone
- this term, declared the idea that only the Bible has the authority to bind the consciences of believers
- Protestants did recognize other forms of authority, such as church creeds and confessions
- but, they saw those authorities as being derived from and subordinate to the authority of God's Word, the Holy Scriptures
- thus, the Reformed quest for a systematic theology is an effort to define the system of doctrine clearly and concisely taught by the Scriptures themselves
- and taken from its most simplistic principle, Reformed Theology is first and foremost theocentric

- that is, it is God centered rather than man centered
- and that is the main difference between Calvinism and Arminianism
- now, I will return to this matter of the difference between Calvinism and Arminianism in a future lesson, but for now, let's take a look at **God's Eternal Plan**
- I want to begin by saying that its unthinkable that a God of infinite wisdom and power would create a world without a definite plan for that world
- and because God is infinite, His plan must extend to every detail of the world's existence
- therefore, if we could see the world in all its history, past, present, and future, we would see that it is following a predetermined course with exact precision
- loved ones, you cannot conceive of God bringing into existence a universe without a plan which would extend to all that would be done in that universe
- the Scriptures teach, that God's providential control extends to all events, even the most minute
- thereby, the Scriptures also teach that God's plan is equally comprehensive
- if God had not foreordained the course of events but waited to see how they would unfold, His decrees would be neither eternal nor immutable
- but, we know however that God is incapable of mistake and that He cannot be surprised by any unforeseen event
- thus, God's plan must therefore include every event in the entire sweep of history
- history, in all its details, even the most minute, is but the unfolding of the eternal purposes of God
- but please note, and I cannot stress this enough, God's decrees are not successively formed as an emergency arises
- but, are all part of one all-comprehensive plan
- friends, we should **never** think of God as suddenly implementing a plan or doing something as a reaction to something which snuck up on Him

- or of something not thought of before
- even the sinful acts of men are included in His plan
- they are foreordained, permitted, and have their exact place in His plan
- in other words, they are controlled and overruled by His divine design
- now, let's look at the Scriptural proof to support these truths
