SESSION 3 — “The Biblical Mandates of Marriage” (Part 2)

Philippians 2:3-4 “Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more _____ important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.”

I. Wives Need to Become Suitable Helpers and Completers.

Genesis 2:18 “... the LORD God said, ‘It is not good for the man to be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him.’”

Ephesians 5:22-23 “Wives, be subject to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife, as Christ also is the head of the church, He Himself being the Savior of the body. But as the church is subject to Christ, so also the wives ought to be to their husbands in everything.”
